



Voyager 550 "new 2000 release"


The year 2000 release of the Whittley Voyager continues a Whittley family tradition that began with the classic Voyager being released as a timber hull in the 1970's.

The new Voyager 550 is the first to be born from Whittley's 'state of the art design facility'. Using Alias design software and Silicon Graphics hardware (the same software used by GM), Whittley Marine has been able to apply computer modeling to produce the most advanced, well performing hull ever.



On the water the 19° deadrise hull is exceptionally stable at rest and delivers a smooth ride even under bumpy conditions.

Voyager... The Familiar Name That Whittley Owners Trust

The release of the Whittley 5.5 Voyager turns the boating clock back to the 1970's when company founder Jim Whittley designed the original Voyager.

The 1970 Whittley Voyager was a stately fibreglass cabin boat, which measured 18'6" or 5.6m long. The classic Voyager proved to be one of the most popular models ever produced under the Whittley brand. The boat featured a hardtop, a large vee berth and plenty of storage.

The essence of the success behind the Voyager was the functionality of the boat. As the name implies, the Voyager proved popular amongst boaters keen on overnight and weekend on-board camping.

The Whittley Voyager was in production from 1970 until 1983 when the model and the name were retired.

"With the release of our new 2000 model 5.5 boat, it seemed only natural that we call up a model name which proved so popular with Whittley owners from the past," Neville Whittley said.

The Voyager from the '70's and the Voyager of the new millennium have much in common. They are virtually the same length, both offer the customer's choice of outboard or sterndrive power and both have the live on-board capability to head off on longer voyages for a weekend or longer.
